Special Horticulture Awards

AHS Achievement Medal

The AHS Achievement Medal is awarded to the originator of each collection of scapes in Division I, Section 11 scoring an average of 90 points or more, and which in the opinion of the judges, shows adequate merit and ***distinctiveness*** as compared with existing cultivars. The cultivar must be a seedling or pre-registered (a pre-registered cultivar is considered a seedling). Entries must be entered by number as assigned by the classification committee. Each of the judges on the panel assigned to judge the entries will point score each scape individually. The score sheets will be returned to the General Show chairman who will tabulate the scores and announce the winner(s).

AHS Award of Appreciation

A rosette may be given at the discretion of the local show committee, not the judges, to one or more non-competitive educational exhibits to show appreciation for the significant efforts involved.

OPHELIA TAYLOR HORTICULTURAL AWARD

This honor is awarded to every collection in Division I, Section 12 scoring 95 or more points per scape.

AHS STANDARD SYSTEM OF AWARDS

Judging of each cultivar in each class shall be done by the AHS system of awards:

- One First (a blue ribbon) which must score 90 points or above
- One Second (a red ribbon) which must score 85 points or above
- One Third (a yellow ribbon) which must score 80 points or above

For registered cultivars, only one blue, one red and one yellow may be awarded in a given name class. For seedlings, each exhibit in the section is judged on its own merit and is thus an award eligible class.

MAJOR AWARDS

The AHS Purple Award is awarded to each blue ribbon winner scoring 95 points or above in sections 1-10 of Division I.

The AHS Rosette is awarded to the most outstanding purple ribbon winning entry in Division I, in each Section 1-10.

Best in Show Rosette will be given to the best of the AHS Rosette winners in Division I, Sections 1 through 10.

Sweepstakes Rosette will be awarded to the exhibitor winning the most blue ribbons in Division I, Sections 1-10. In case of tie, the exhibitor with the most Purple Ribbons is declared the winner. If still a tie, red then yellow, are counted as tiebreakers.

JUDGING STANDARDS FOR ACCREDITED SHOWS

1. All judging of an accredited show will employ AHS standards.
2. All horticulture sections must be judged by AHS Exhibition judges.
3. Each panel of judges shall be the final authority for each section and group in which it judges.
4. Only the Classification Chair has the authority to disqualify any entry that is damaged or does not conform to the schedule.
5. The appropriate AHS scale of points will be used for: (1) Registered cultivars on-scape, (2) Seedlings on-scape and (3) Individual flowers of registered cultivars off-scape.
6. The AHS standard system of awards will be used.
7. All scapes receiving the AHS rosettes or purple ribbons must score 95 or above by the AHS scale of points.
8. Registered cultivars will be classified as registered, by size, and by form; they will be grouped alphabetically within each section. No distinction is to be made between the classification of diploids and tetraploids.
9. Each registered cultivar shall constitute a name class. A single entry may be given an award if the judges consider it a superior exhibit. An exhibitor may have only one entry per name class.
10. Each seedling or pre-registered cultivar (a pre-registered cultivar is considered a seedling) shall constitute a class to be judged on individual merit. Each entry may be given an award if considered a superior exhibit.
11. If Division I, AHS Rosette eligible Sections 1-10, are subdivided or judged by more than one panel of judges, the purple awards must be point scored to determine a single winner since there is only one AHS rosette for each of these Sections.

HORTICULTURE RULES

1. All horticulture exhibits eligible for AHS rosettes and medals must be entered on-scape.
2. Registered cultivars are to be entered on scapes whose overall height does not exceed 36 inches.
3. All seedlings (including pre-registered cultivars) shall be severed as near the base as possible regardless of height. A seedling having won the AHS rosette in any other show is not eligible.
4. Entry tags for seedlings must be marked with the word SEEDLING in the space for cultivar name. Names, numbers or any other identifying marks are not permitted on the visible portion of the folded tag.
5. Eligibility for exhibitors in the Youth sections shall continue through the end of the calendar year following the youth's eighteenth birthday. (If youth entries are to be confined to the Youth section, this must be stated in the schedule. However, youth entries may not be denied in the Seedling, Popularity Poll, and Achievement sections.)
6. Cultivars listed on the official spider list must be exhibited in Section 6 unless they are: (1) a Popularity Poll exhibit, (2) part of a local collection, (3) a Youth Section exhibit, or (4) registered as a multiform cultivar. (Refer to Multiform Classification Code on page 7 of this sample schedule.)
7. Cultivars whose names are not listed in the AHS checklists or supplements may not be exhibited in any Division, Section, Class or Group where registered cultivars are specified.
8. Popularity Poll cultivars must be exhibited only in Section 9 unless they are Youth exhibits.
9. Unusual form cultivars, registered as such, must be entered in Section 7 and only those listed on the official Unusual Form cultivars list may be entered in Section 7 unless they are: (1) a Popularity Poll exhibit, (2) part of a local collection, (3) a Youth Section exhibit, or (4) registered as a multiform cultivar.

GENERAL SHOW RULES

1. Exhibition is open to all daylily growers. Entries must have been grown, groomed and entered by the exhibitor.
2. Only AHS Members are eligible to win AHS rosettes and other society sponsored awards. However, they may be new members who join at the show.
3. All entries will be received (checked by the Classification committee) between the hours of 8:30 AM to 11:00 AM and must remain in place until the end of the show. No entry will be accepted and placed after 11:00 AM.
4. Exhibits must remain in place until 4:00 PM. Remaining exhibits will be discarded after 4:30 PM.
5. Uniform containers and official AHS entry tags will be furnished by the club.
6. Only members of the placement committee are eligible to place entries in the display area.
7. Judging begins at 11:30 AM. Only the Judges, Clerks, General Show Chair, Judges Chair, Classification Chair, and the Photographer are permitted in the exhibition area during judging.
8. The Show Committee will exercise all precautions in handling and protecting exhibits, but neither they nor Washington Park Botanical Garden can be held responsible for loss, damage, or breakage to any exhibit that may occur.

MULTIFORM CLASSIFICATION CODE FOR SHOWS

Before 2008, polymerous flowers were exhibited in the corresponding single flower sections by size. Even though these and multiform flowers are relatively few in numbers, they and the multiform flowers are now exhibited as indicated below. In order to assist Classification Chairs in determining where to place them in a show, a Multiform Classification Code has been designed. A show section may be subdivided into classes if enough cultivars are to warrant it.

Please note that it is recommended that the Classification and Tabulation committees use the AHS Online Registration Database or the AHS Electronic Checklist CD to classify each registered cultivar by typing the cultivar name into the 'Advanced Search' screen. The appropriate Horticultural Division I and II show section will be shown automatically. This will make classification and placement of any registered cultivar easy and almost foolproof.

EXHIBITION SECTIONS

DIVISION I: Horticulture ON-SCAPE

Section 1: Registered, EXTRA LARGE Flowers
7" or more in diameter

Section 2: Registered, LARGE Flowers
4.5" or more but under 7" in diameter

Section 3: Registered, SMALL Flowers
3" or more but under 4.5" in diameter

Section 4: Registered, Miniature Flowers
Less than 3" in diameter

Section 5: Registered, Double and Polymerous Flowers

Section 6: Registered, Spider Flowers
Spider ratio 4.0:1 or greater

Section 7: Registered, Unusual Form Flowers

Section 8: Youth Exhibits
Registered cultivars, any size, form or pattern

Section 9: Regional Popularity Poll
Primal Scream, Webster's Pink Wonder, Ruby Spider, All American Chief, Heavenly Angel Ice must not be exhibited in any other section, unless it is a youth exhibit.

Section 10: Seedlings

Section 11: The American Hemerocallis Society Achievement Medal
Three scapes of a single seedling or pre-registered cultivar severed as near the base as possible. An exhibitor may have multiple entries in this section. (See explanation elsewhere in this schedule for more information)

Section 12: The Ophelia Taylor Horticultural Award
Class 1: Five scapes: different registered cultivars
Class 2: Five scapes: different seedlings

SHOW SCHEDULE

- 8:00a-11:00a** Registration / Classification / Placement.
- Exhibitors may arrive with their exhibits and groom near the show location. A small grooming area will be provided. It is recommended you come to the show location with your exhibits already groomed. Friendly faces will be on hand to help you with your exhibits.
- 11:00a** No new entries accepted for placement. Only entries in the possession of the placement or classification committee will be accepted for judging. All other entries will be placed in the non-judged display area. The show chair will resolve discrepancies, and the decision will be final.
- 11:30a** Final placement and registration completed. This time allows for classification to complete entries that had been received at or before 11:00. This time also allows the placement committee to make final adjustments.
- 11:30a-1:00p** Exhibition Judging. Only judges, clerks and show chairs allowed inside judging area.
- 12:00p-4:00p** Membership and Education Table open.
- 1:00p** Show open to public.
- 1:00p-1:30p** Tabulation and awards placement.
- 4:00p** Show closed. Exhibits and awards must be claimed by 4:15pm. Dismantling begins at 4:00pm.
